The AbilityFirst College to Career Program provides supports that empower young adults who are enrolled in Pasadena City College to succeed in their post-secondary education and career goals.

How does the College to Career Program work?

The AbilityFirst College to Career Program is a full-time, year-round day program from 7:45am to 2pm. The program is designed to offer a supported mainstream life experience to individuals who demonstrate the desire and potential to succeed in a post-secondary educational environment.

The goal of the College to Career program is to provide a structured environment to help each person design and embark on a community and adult education path that matches his or her interests and needs. The program assists participants to identify their goals, create a plan to achieve those goals, enroll in appropriate classes and access college and community resources in order to ensure success.
